

Economic Ties with Israel and New Zealand

- In 1994 Israel opened a trade office in Auckland and the New Zealand and Israel Trade Association, known as NZITA, was established.
- Israel Trade Association, known as NLTI A, was established.

 2002, New Zealand sent about \$12.5 million of exports to strael and received \$60.1 million in imports, including fertilises, plastic and scap.


 By 2005, annual exports from New Zealand to Israel reached IXS15.834 (11%), preserved meat or off liproducts (10%), scalent (10.89%), and medications (7.4%). Exports from Israel to New Zealand, mostly marufactured strates and reached the strates and resident and strates and resident and strates and resident (1.4%). Strates (1.4%), and inject printers (3.8%), reached IXS88.15 million.
